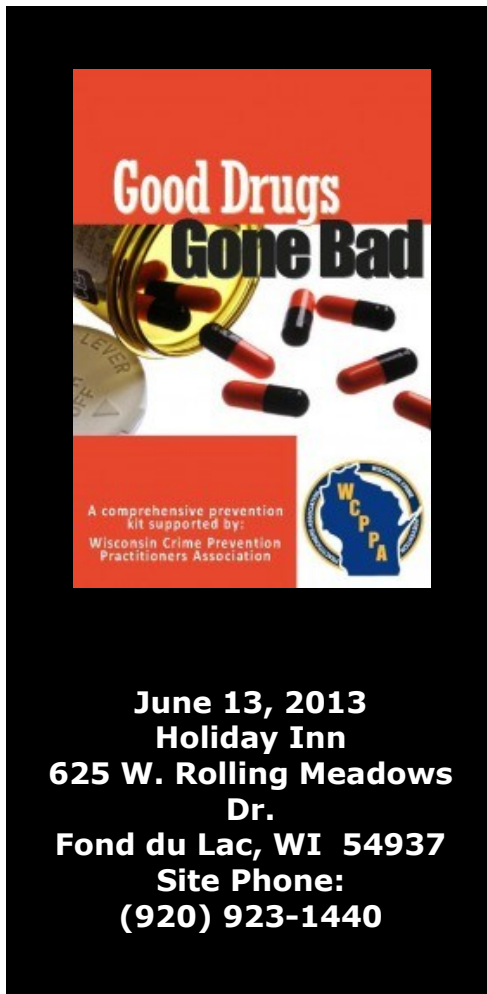

## Good Drugs Gone Bad: A train-the-trainer workshop on prescription drug abuse prevention

Prescription drug abuse is an epidemic, cutting across geographic, racial, ethnic and socioeconomic boundaries. Two-thirds (65 percent) of teens who abuse prescription painkillers say they got them from family members and friends (NSDUH, 2010).

Eighteen percent of Wisconsin high school students have reported taking a prescription drug without a doctor's prescription (2011 Wisconsin Youth Risk Behavior Survey)

Teens don't see this behavior as risky. They see their parents taking medicine— and they believe that since medicine is created and tested in a scientific environment it is therefore safer to use than street drugs.

Come and learn about the real dangers of prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) drug abuse.

- Learn about the growing problem of prescription drug and OTC drug abuse.
- Become familiar with emerging drug trends.
