As we countdown to 2014-15, we draw closer to the deadline for the full scale implementation of the mandated Educator Effectiveness requirement. **Regardless of the system that your district selects to evaluate educators and monitor effectiveness, we know that writing high quality SLOs will be a part of that system.** Next year 2013-14 the full scale pilot across the state will be implemented, and revisions will be made state-wide after this pilot.

- Understand how building, team, and individual SLOs are connected
- Analyze example SLOs to critique the quality of the SLO
- Write a SLO either using mock or actual needs assessment data
