

Aligning IEPs with the Common Core State Standards

Description:

Traditionally, IEPs have focused on a student acquiring basic academic, access and/or functional skills and have had little relationship to a specific academic area or grade-level expectations. Aligning a student's Individualized Education Program (IEP) with the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) describes a process in which the IEP team has incorporated state standards in its development. The IEP is directly linked to and framed by the CCSS for the grade in which the student is enrolled or will be enrolled. The components are the same as the traditional IEP but provides for greater access to the general education curriculum for students with disabilities focusing on closing the achievement gap. This creates a program that is aimed at getting the student to a proficient level on the CCSS in addition to addressing functional and/or behavioral needs of the student.

Workshop Objectives:

- Define IEPs aligned with the CCSS.
- Discuss the rationale for aligning IEPs with CCSS, from a legal and educational perspective.
- Identify the components and steps involved in creating an IEP aligned with the CCSS.
- Address classroom practices that facilitate access to IEPs aligned with the CCSS by students with disabilities in general education classrooms.
- Learn how aligning IEPs with CCSS serves as a mechanism to support access to the general education curriculum for students with disabilities.
- Discuss the current shift to the CCSS, and potential implications for students with disabilities.
- Learn to develop measurable annual goals aligned with grade-level content standards.
- Review analyzing classroom data and assessing, monitoring and reporting student progress.
