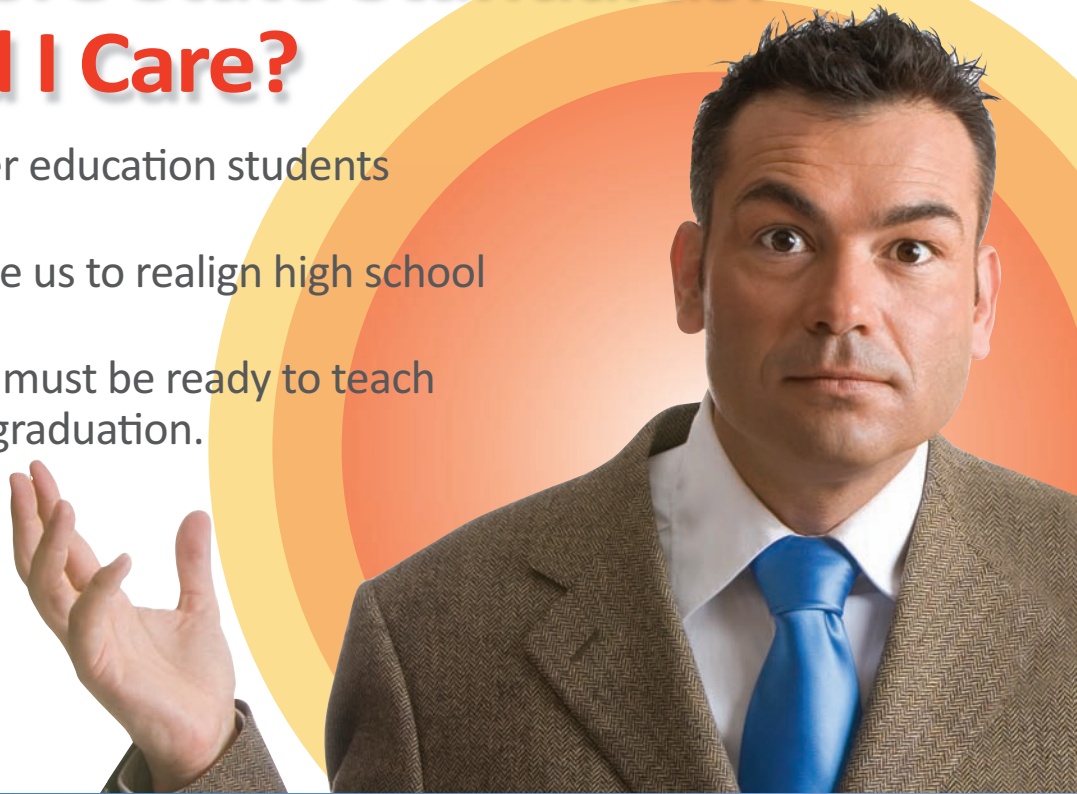


# Common Core State Standards: Why Should I Care?
