Description

Wisconsin school districts are moving rapidly to implement Rtl and PBIS, comprehensive systems that are designed to use data to identify struggling students before they fail and rapidly provide additional needed supports. Common activities involve screening, functional behavioral assessments (FBAs) and behavioral intervention plans (BIPs), building consultation teams, progress monitoring, social-academic intervention groups (SAIGs), and case management. Most of these activities happen in the general education setting and raise questions for schools: When are parents to be involved? Will we notify them of an activity or seek consent? What kind of consent will we seek? Do students have the right to assent or dissent to interventions?

This training will review the relevant statutes and ethical guidance regarding professional practice within a comprehensive, Rtl system. Participants will engage in an activity specifically designed to help them identify when and how parent notification and consent could be used for specific Rtl activities in their respective schools. Time will also be devoted to a discussion of how the role of school social workers is changing because of Rtl. Small group discussion of real-life ethical challenges experienced by Wisconsin school social workers and other pupil services professionals will be included.

Workshop Objectives

- Participants will understand and apply the relevant statutes and ethical guidance to determine how parent notification and consent could be used within their respective school districts' Rtl system.
- Participants will gain an understanding how the role of school social workers is changing as school districts adopt Rtl.
