She is the author of *Reading with Meaning: Teaching Comprehension in the Primary Grades* (2002) and *Teaching with Intention: Defining Beliefs, Aligning Practice, Taking Action* (2008) both published with Stenhouse. She and her students are also featured in the video series *Happy Reading!* and *The Joy of Conferring*. Debbie now presents workshops across the country and works extensively with schools and districts on long-range planning and development of literacy initiatives. She worked for many years with the Denver-based Public Education and business Coalition (PEBC) and has been an adjunct professor at the University of Denver and Regis University.
