Purpose

To provide school nurses, administrators, faculty, school resource officers, and parents with a systematic approach to recognizing and assessing individuals in the academic environment who are using and are impaired by drugs, in order to provide early intervention. **All participants should attend the first day, but the second day may be optional except for nurses, school liaison officers, or those who have direct medical or psychological assessment responsibilities.**

Training Covers

- Concept of drugs that impair in the academic environment.
- Drug choice within a community.
- Observable effects of each of the seven drug categories
- Observable effects of various drug combinations.
- Medical conditions that appear similar to drug impairment.
- Appropriate procedures for dealing with drug impaired or medically impaired individuals.
