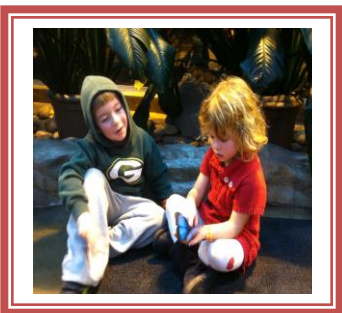


Play-Based Assessment & Curriculum: Addressing Special Education Eligibility and Rigorous Standards

Join us to hear Toni Linder, nationally and internationally known expert on play and author of *Transdisciplinary Play-Based Assessment & Intervention* and *Read, Play and Learn* curriculum. Dr. Linder will share what she has learned through her career as a higher ed professor and researcher at the Morgridge College of Education, University of Denver, Colorado and her ongoing direct work with young children and their families. Bringing her additional perspective as a special educator to the discussion, Dr. Linder will guide a two-day training. We will explore how to use the most natural learning strategy children have, play, with enough intentionality and structure to address many different educational requirements – from special education eligibility to rigorous content such as the Common core State Standards.

- Articulate the scientific support for play as the primary vehicle for early learning
- Provide examples of play as an instructional strategy capable of addressing rigorous content, such as the Common Core State Standards
- Present rationale & specifics of play-based assessment
- Examine *Transdisciplinary Play Based Assessment 2* as a well-known example of play-based assessment
- Explore how play based assessment can be used:
 - To get a standard score
 - To determine eligibility for special education
 - To make instructional decisions
 - For ongoing assessment
