The Sheltered Instruction Observation Protocol (SIOP) was created to provide classroom teachers a clear and comprehensive model for delivering sheltered content instruction to English Learners. During this three-day class, teachers will become familiar with the SIOP model in a variety of ways. Participants will use Making Content Comprehensible for English Learners (Echevarria, Vogt & Short, 2013) to explore each of the 8 components of SIOP: Lesson Preparation, Building Background, Comprehensible Input, Strategies, Interaction, Practice & Application, Lesson Delivery, Review & Assessment. Those attending will also have opportunities to reflect on their current practice, collaborate with their peers, and implement their understanding of SIOP into lesson planning.

Alexis has been working with English Learners for the past 10 years. During the past 6 years, she has been an integral part of the sustained professional development around SIOP in the Verona Area School District.
