The value of PALS data is to use it to guide your instruction! In this workshop you will be provided time to analyze your PALS data and reports and create instructional plans.

Workshop content will focus upon:

- Orientation and review of all of the PALS reports
- Interpretation strategies for each report
- Guided practice time to analyze your own data
- Differentiated instructional planning for each student
- Identification of intervention groups
- Creation of progress monitoring plan with PALS Quick Checks
- Overview of PALS instructional resources
