The Dropout Early Warning System (DEWS) is a data tool that can be used to predict the risk of a 7th - 9th grade student not graduating from high school in four years.

This half-day session will provide an opportunity to try out the DEWS and related dashboards within the WISEDash data system, with a specific focus on students with disabilities.

Participants should have a WAMS ID and permission to access data for the middle school and/or high school students in their districts, and a laptop computer. Other early warning signs will also be discussed.
