

Implementing a Culturally Responsive Multi-Level System of Support:

Reviewing K-5 Reading Instruction at the Universal Level of Support

This **THREE-DAY**, **TEAM-BASED** workshop will guide teams through understanding what is required to effectively implement a systemic and systematic K-5 Reading Instruction at the universal level within a culturally responsive multi-level system of support. Teams will learn about research and evidence-based practices that support all students at the universal level. Participants will review and analyze their system and leave with a plan of action.

Audience

- District teams of three or more, including the principal or school/district leader (essential)
- Cross representation of general education and special education teachers
- Specialists including: reading specialist, curriculum director, literacy coach, Title One, ELL, gifted and talented, early childhood

Outcomes

- Understand the need for a strong systemic reading foundation built upon organizational trust and common foundational beliefs.
- Build school/district level team capacity including cultural competence when designing and providing comprehensive literacy instruction for ALL students at the universal level.
- Review and outline core reading components from the Common Core State Standards.
- Review and outline instructional time, instructional grouping, and universal classroom environment.
- Understand the effectiveness of common language and systemic best practice in universal reading instruction.
- Investigate and discuss high quality systemic universal reading instruction as it relates to the WI-RtI framework; including the essential elements of collaboration and balanced assessment.
- Analyze, prioritize and plan around actions that will have a positive impact on student learning.

Preparation

 Participants should bring a completed student data profile provided upon registration along with documentation of their current reading programs, practices, strategies, and schedules used to deliver K-5 universal reading instruction.
